The investment team aims to identify companies operating in sectors that are assumed they will benefit from long-term structural trends, **linked to demographic trends**.



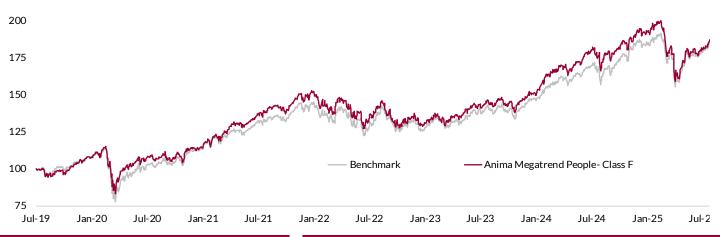
The Fund invests in **global stocks** with an active style and mainly with a thematic and tactical approach.

### **Monthly Fund Manager's comment**

In July, the MSCI AC World Index recorded a performance of +4.4%, driven by easing trade tension, the secular growth theme in AI, and a better-thanexpected US earnings season. Over the past month, China led regional returns, while the US continued its rally toward new highs, despite persistent risk factors such as high interest rates, geopolitical tensions and tariff uncertainty. On July 7th, the 90-day suspension on reciprocal tariffs, originally set to expire on July 9th, was extended until August 1st. In the following weeks, President Trump signed several bilateral agreements, which are set to be implemented starting August 7th, while countries not included will face the impact of reciprocal tariffs. Among the most notable are the agreements with Japan and the European Union, establishing a 15% base tariff rate, with some exemptions, in exchange for commitments to invest in the US and to purchase increased volumes of US LNG. The trade agreement could serve as a key driver in extending market leadership beyond financial and defense, and potentially supporting a resurgence in European outperformance, further reinforced by the ECB's easing cycle, given that a significant portion of EU consumer wealth is concentrated in real estate. During the month, the fund registered a positive net return of 3.7%. The overweight in healthcare, which continued to underperform the broader market, contributed negatively to the fund performance, but it was partially compensated for by the picking in sector. On the other hand, the overweight in technology was rewarding, also, the stock selection in communication services, industrials and financials contributed positively to the performance of the fund. In the healthcare sector, the market is witnessing the anticipated consolidation trend. With the looming loss of exclusivity (LOE) for some of the bestselling medicines in history, there is an upward trend in deals that are immediately revenuegenerating or focused on late-stage assets, aimed at sustaining growth beyond the patent cliff. The recent Merck-Verona and Sanofi-Blueprint acquisitions clearly reflect the pressure on large biopharma players to offset significant patent cliff challenges toward the end of the decade. Over the month of July, all five major U.S. banks reported and exceeded second-quarter 2025 earnings expectations, driven by stronger-than-expected trading and improved investment banking activity. Resilient capital markets and "higher-for-longer" volatility supported top-line performance. Results reinforced confidence in earnings quality despite ongoing macro headwinds. July ended with the results of some of the big US tech names all delivering solid Q2 2025 earnings. Microsoft posted better-than-expected growth in cloud services, driven by sustained Al demand. Meta beat revenue forecasts, supported by strong engagement and Advertising growth, particularly on Reels and WhatsApp. Amazon instead disappointed again on AWS growth which continues to underperform Microsoft's while the online retail business showed good top line growth during the period on tariff uncertainty. Apple's results were uninspiring driven by iPhone sales and little momentum in other products. Overall, the tech giants demonstrated resilience and ongoing monetization of Al-related opportunities. Equity markets have shown remarkable resilience since the lows reached in April, but looking ahead, seasonality could influence market performance during the traditionally challenging months of August and September. Valuations remain elevated relative to the expected EPS growth of 5% for 2025F, but the increase in corporate cash flows generated by OBBBA ("One Big Beautiful Bill Act") could represent a support factor. However, the current upward phase is more fundamentally driven than is commonly believed, and thus, from a strategic perspective, we remain positive.
