Investment Strategy is based on fundamental sector analysis, mainly relying on **FCF metrics**, with a particular focus on US issuers with a stable growth profile



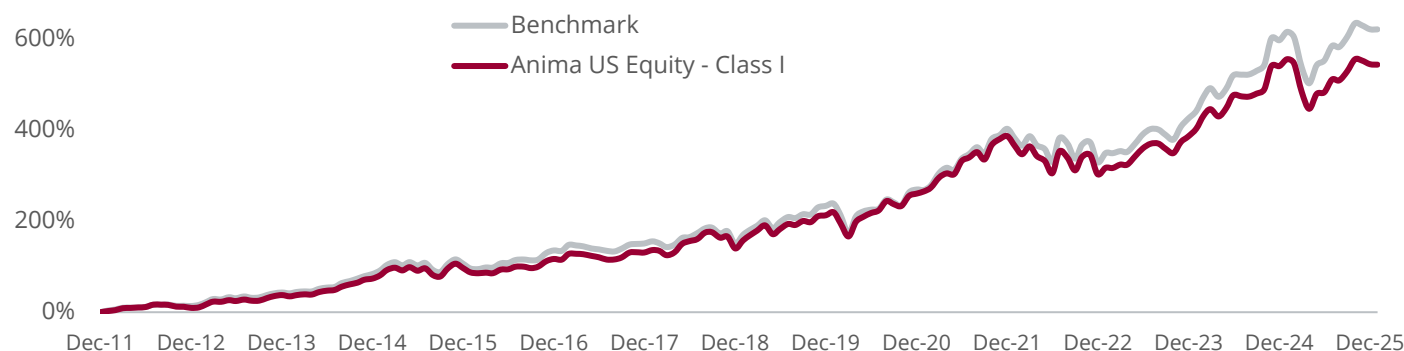
Universe & Benchmark

Monthly Fund Manager's comment

The S&P 500 was +1.5% on a total return basis in January, outperforming investment grade corporate bonds (+0.4%), long-term Treasuries (essentially flat) and T-bills (+0.3%) but lagging ex-US equities (+6.0% in USD) and gold (+14.1%, despite a late-month sell-off). The VIX was +16.7% amid geopolitical uncertainty. In a sign of broadening, the equal-weighted S&P 500 (+3.4%) outperformed the cap-weighted index, with the Magnificent 7 having a negative (10bp) contribution to the S&P 500's return. Energy (14.4%) was the standout, boosted from a) rising Geopolitical tensions (incl. Venezuela, Iran & Greenland), b) the commodities trade, c) global growth narrative. Defence (11.4%) was also boosted by some of these drivers, as well as Trump stating he would increase the US' defence budget. Materials (8.6%), Consumer Staples (7.5%) and Industrials (6.6%) were the other sector standouts. Seven of the 11 sectors outperformed the S&P 500, where Financials (-2.6%) and Tech (-1.7%) were the worst-performing S&P 500 sectors and Health Care (-0.2%) was also in the red. In the US, data continued to point to a strong growth backdrop, which was a core driver behind the broadening rally. This saw Tech pullback from the prolonged period of outperformance with the theme of dispersion and increased selectivity continued in January, with Semis vs Software in the spotlight (23.5% relative outperformance). Q3 GDP was revised higher to 4.4% QoQ, consumer strength was the more consequential point with real consumer spending increased 0.3% and on track to increase at around a 3% annual rate in Q4. Moreover, the labor market remain in focus, with the trend of 'no fire no hire' prevailing in January releases. While NFPs printed on the softer side at 50k (vs 70k expected and a revised-down 56k in Nov), the unemployment rate actually decreased in December to 4.4% (from 4.6% prior) and Claims generally surprised to the downside through January. Inflation continued on an easing trend, with CPI holding steady at 2.7% YoY, but Core surprising to the downside at 2.6% YoY (vs 2.7% expected). At the end of the month, the fund delivered a performance flat relative to its benchmark. During the month we reduced the exposure to tech through the sales of names within both Semis and Software sub sectors and brought the sector to underweight relative to benchmark. Despite the underweight positioning, the fund remains skewed to tech quality stocks between its top holdings. The proceeds from the sales in tech have been redirected into both Materials and Staples, especially into packaged goods and steel producers, which, now, alongside Financials and Energy remain the positive tilts where the fund is invested relative to benchmark. To conclude, we remain committed to a selective and fundamentals-driven approach, as long as this backdrop holds and market leadership continues to be supported by earnings delivery.
